

The webinar came to an end by 5.00 pm with vote of thanks by Mrs. Jeena Varghese (Programme Officer NSS).







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# NSS AND PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT




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#### **CHALLENGES IN COVID 19 FOR NSS VOLUNTEERS**


















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#### **ROAD SAFETY AWARENESS PROGRAMME**


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


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#### **AWARENESS ON GREEN INITIATIVES**
