



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#### 1. NIRMALA ARTS AND SCIENCE COLLEGE MULANTHURUTHY- A BRIEF ACCOUNT

Educational activities of the Nirmala Charitable Trust were started in the year 1956 with functioning of a primary school at Thalacode in Chottanikkara panchayat, which was a very undeveloped locality at that time. The founder of the trust Very Rev. O.C. Kuriakose Cor-Episcopa was a great visionary. He wanted to have pre-primary to higher education institutions under the Trust. The school was soon upgraded to Upper Primary and High School with parallel English Medium divisions. English medium schools were rare those days. Hence, students from faraway places also joined the school. Boarding facility for students was provided at Thalacode since 1965. In the year 1967 first batch of SSLC passed out from the school. St. Mary's High School Thalacode was one of the 15 schools securing 100% pass in SSLC in the state. Very Rev. O.C. Kuriakose, who was also the Headmaster of the school, was honoured with best teacher award by Government of Kerala. On February 2, 1993, V.Rev.O.C Kuriakose Kor-Episcopa entered his heavenly abode.

The Trust continued its educational activities with great vigor as per the wishes of the founder who is the leading light in all our ventures. In 1998, a higher secondary school was sanctioned at Thalacode. A Teacher Education College namely Nirmala Training college, with affiliation from Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam for B.Ed course was started at Thalacode in the year 2005.

Nirmala Arts & Science College, Mulanthuruthy was started in the year 2007 with sanction from Government of Kerala and affiliation from Mahatma Gandhi University, with Sri. George Kuriakose as Manager and Prof. V.G. Remanan as the Principal. The main block of the college building was consecrated by H.G. Dr. Mathews Mar Severiose, Metropolitan of Kandanad and Patron of the College on the 13<sup>th</sup> of July 2007. Prof. V.G. Remanan continued his exemplary service as the principal till 2016. In 2016 Prof. Daisy N O took over as the principal. Further in 2018 Prof. Daisy N O assumed charge as college Dean and Dr. C.A Geetha took over as the principal.

The College started functioning in 2007 with two UG programmes - B. Com (Finance & Taxation) and BBA. After two years, in 2009, college added one more UG programme in Commerce, B. Com (Computer Applications). In the year 2012 the college elevated its status by starting a PG programme M.Com (Finance) . The college commenced its first UG programme under science stream, BCA in 2014. Further college added two more UG programmes B.A. (Communicative English) and B.Sc. Psychology in 2015 and in 2019 respectively. The college also got sanction from government of Kerala to start MSc in Psychology in 2021. Presently the college has a total strength of 800 students, 42 teachers and 11 non-teaching staff.

For further development of the activities of the college, construction work of an annex building was started in the year 2019 and the work is still under progress. The college is currently in the process of getting accreditation from NAAC. Management is taking every effort to make the college an institution of excellence as per the vision.

#### DURATION

The duration of UG Programmes shall be 6 semesters. The duration of odd semesters shall be from June to October and that of even semesters from November to March. There shall be a semester break after all semesters and 2-month vacation during April and May in every academic year.

#### SCHEME AND SYLLABUS

The UG Programmes shall include (a) Common Courses I & II (b) Core Courses (c) Complementary Courses (d) Open course.

#### **EVALUATION**

The evaluation of each course shall contain 2 parts:

- (i) Internal or In-Semester Assessment (ISA)
- (ii) External or End-Semester Assessment (ESA)

The internal-external assessment ratio shall be 1: 4, for both courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for external evaluation and 20 marks for internal evaluation. For all courses (theory and practical), grades are given on a 07-point scale based on the total percentage of marks (ISA + ESA) as given below.

#### ASSIGNMENTS

Students have to do Assignments from 1st to 4th Semesters. At least one assignment should be done in each semester for all courses.

#### **SEMINAR/ VIVA**

A student shall present a seminar in the fifth semester and appear for viva voce in the sixth semester.

#### **TEST PAPER**

Students have to attend two test papers in each semester for each course.

#### DURATION

The duration of PG programmes shall be four semesters.

#### **EXAMINATIONS**

There shall be university examination at the end of each semester. Practical examinations shall be conducted by the university at the end of each semester. Project evaluation and Viva-Voce shall be conducted at the end of the programme only.

#### **EVALUATION**

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts external and internal with a weightage

75% and 25% respectively.

#### Components of Internal(CE) and External Evaluation(ESE)

Grades shall be given to the evaluation of theory/project/practical/comprehensive viva-voce and all internal evaluations are based on the direct grading system. The components of internal evaluation of theory courses consist of assignment, seminar and best two examinations. The components of internal evaluation of practical consists of written or lab test, lab involvement and record and viva.

#### **DIRECT GRADING SYSTEM**

Direct grading system based on a 6-point scale is used to evaluate the internal and external examinations taken by the students for various courses of study.

No separate minimum is required for internal evaluation for a pass, but a minimum C grade is required for a pass in an external evaluation.

### **13. GENERAL RULES AND CONDUCT**

- 1. Classes begin at 9 am. All students shall be present in the college in the prescribed time.
- 2. The college campus is a 'No-smoking Zone'. Any violation in this regard from any person will be strictly dealt with.
- 3. Disciplinary action will be initiated against anyone who is found to have consumed alcohol or other intoxicants within the college campus.
- 4. All students are expected to wear the uniform prescribed by the college and they should also wear identity cards.
- 5. Usage of mobile phones by the students without the permission of college authorities is

strictly prohibited in the campus. In the event of any violation in this regard, the Principal or the Tutor is empowered to seize the phone and to impose appropriate punishments.

- 6. All students should handle with care the property of the college and shall do everything to preserve cleanliness of the college premises, building, furniture and other articles.
- 7. The loss or damage thus caused to the college property or articles will be made good by realizing double the value of loss or damage from the student concerned.
- 8. No student shall be allowed to enter the campus with four wheelers unless permitted by the college authorities.
- 9. Vehicle speeds shall be limited to 10 Km/hr inside campus.
- 10. The entry of outsiders into the campus is strictly prohibited unless permitted by the college authorities; no one shall bring or entertain outsiders within the campus or in the college.
- 11. No political activities shall be permitted in the campus except those official activities which are specifically permitted or sponsored by the college authorities.
- 12. It is forbidden to organize or attend meetings other than the official ones which are specifically permitted by the principal.
- 13. All expressions or activities which are ragging, immoral, anti- social, communal and antinational are strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- 14. In the interest of the institution and for the sake of discipline, the principal is entitled to refuse admission to any applicant, to suspend or dismiss or take any other punitive action on any student for his/her misconduct.

### **14. THE COLLEGE LIBRARY AND RULES**

The college library is the key resource of information for the academic community. The Library Block consists of:

- 1) General reference Section
- 2) Audio Visual room
- 3) Post Graduate section

#### Library Rules

- > The Library will be opened on all working days from 9 am to 4.30 pm.
- Strict silence should be maintained in the library.
- Foot wears are not allowed inside the library.
- > Books and other personal belongings should not be taken into the library.
- All books except reference books are issued to students and staff for a fortnight. After the expiry of 14 days the defaulter has to pay a fine of Rs.2 per day per book. A super fine of Rs.5 will be charged for overdue per day.
- > All members of the staff and students are entitled to use the library for reference of books.
- > A student who damages a book shall be fined in proportion to the damage.

### **15. CAMPUS FACILITIES AND AMENITIES**

**1.** Auditorium: The auditorium has a seating capacity of 1000 people. It caters to the general academic and cultural assembly of the community.

**2. Student Hall:** The Student hall which can accommodate 300 students at a time is meant for conducting departmental functions, club activities and meetings of various student support organizations.

**3.** Seminar Hall: The Seminar hall which can accommodate 200 people with audio visual facilities for seminars and conferences of an exclusive nature.

**4.** Library: The College library with a collection of over 6000 books and a subscription of about 30 Periodicals, journals and newspapers, is the key source of academic assistance to the community. There are special sections for reading, lending and reference.

**5. Canteen:** The College canteen caters to the nutritional needs of the staff and students at subsidized rate. The canteen functions from 9.30 AM to 3.30 PM.

6. College Bus: Students and Staff can avail the service if needed.

### **16. RULES FOR COLLLECTION OF FEES**

Tuition fee shall be collected at the beginning of each semester on dates notified by the college office. If the fees are not paid on or before the due date a fine will be levied. The amount of fine for the delayed payment of fees is Rs 50 during the first 10 days of the due date and Rs 100 and Rs 250 for the payment thereafter. Fee in respect of physical education, University affiliation, contribution towards students' group insurance and student welfare Fund are collected with semester fee for odd semesters. UG and PG Students in Psychology should remit laboratory fee also with their fee for odd semester.

### **17. STUDENTS' ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE**
